Dates given below of the Fox family were copied in 1929 from the family Bible records, the Bible then in possession of Mrs. Frances Alwilda (Burnight) Cote of Los Angeles, Calif. (2712 East 5th St.).

Radolph Fox was born 24 Sept. 1776 in New York State. Polly Slater his his wife was born 20 July 1785.

They were married about 1806, and probably at Crooked Lake, N.Y.

Rudolph Fox was one of the early residents of Dearborn Co., Ind., and resided at Rising Sun, Dearborn Co., (now Ohio Co.), Indiana, having removed there from Columbus, Ohio in 1823 but had previously resided at Crooked Lake, N.Y. (was living there 7 May 1815).

He was the son of Lames Fox one of the pioneer settlers of Management and Lames Fox one of the pioneer s

He was the son of James Fox, one of the pioneer settlers of Manchester township, Dearborn Co., Ind., who purchased from the U.S. Government in 1832 a portion of Sec. 5, in that township (See History of Dearborn County). The tradition is that on his maternal line he was of "Pennsylvania Dutch" ancestry.

After the death of his wife Polly (Slater), Rudolph Fox married a second wife and by her had two daughters, namely, Chloe and Betsy, of whom nothing further is r memembered. They may have died young.

Rudolph and Polly (Slater) Fox had eight children, the four old-

er ones born at Crooked Lake, N.Y.:

She married at Rising Sun, Ind., 12 Sept. 1833, Gideon Tibbetts of Manchester township, Dearborn Co., Ind., later one of the first settlers of Portland. Oregon, was a member of the Oregon State Legislature in 1877, and who was of genealogical line (Benjamin, William, Revolutionary soldier), Caot. Benjamin, Henry, Jeremiah, Henry, The said Gideon Tibbetts was born 2 Sept. 1809 in Corinth, Penobscot Co., Maine, the son of Benjamin and Hannah (Snow) Tibbetts who remobed with their family of ten children in 1816 to Manchester township, Dearborn Co., Indiana.

 Gideon and Mary (Fox) Tibbetts removed to Portland, Oregon

vi. Melissa Ann Fox, born 20 July 1820 in Columbus, Ohio (so stated in her obituary); died near Monticello, Johne Co., Iowa, 13th Feb. 1882, aged 62 years, 7 mos. She married 8 March 1840, Fletcher Burnight, farmer, of Pleasant View, Franklin township, Marion Co., Ind., who was born 1 Feh. 1820 at Lebanon, Pa., the son of Jeremiah Burnight, born 16 Sept. 1779 in the Highlands of Scotland, came to America when he was 21 years of age, and his wife Phoebe Warrall, born 8 April 1785 in Marple township, Delaware Co., Pa. (married 16 July 1802 in Marple, whose genealogical line is as follows: (Seth. 4 Jonathan, 3 Peter, 2 Peter). Jeremiah and Fhoebe (Worrall) Burnight removed with their family from Lebanon, Pa., in 1823 to Franklin township,

Marion Co., Indiana. In 1842, two years after their marriage, Fletcher and Melissa Ann (Fox) Burnight removed from Franklin township, Marion Co., Ind., to Jones Co., Iowa and located at Bowen's Prairie, near Monticello. Here they passed the last ten years of their
